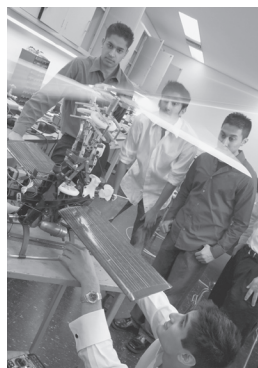
The Camras Scholars Program is named for Marvin Camras (EE '40, MS '42), a pioneer in magnetic recording technology and IIT alumnus, professor, and community leader. With enhanced access to research and service, in addition to leadership development and a full tuition scholarship benefit, the Camras Scholars Program brings our best students together with our best opportunities.

The Camras Scholars lead the campus in athletics, leadership, service, entrepreneurship, and research – the Camras Pathways to Professional Excellence. Camras Scholars have solved age-old problems in structural engineering, developed novel methods for improving campus life, and increased the overall academic and social ethic of their fellow students in just over a decade.

And where do Camras Scholars go after IIT? Caterpillar and NASA are two of the big names. Many go onto prestigious graduate programs. Other scholars have returned to their hometowns and immediately made an impact in community organizations. The interprofessional spirit at IIT makes for more than just good engineers, scientists, architects, and others. It challenges our students to go beyond their fields of study and see the rest of the world – and the Camras Scholars are no exception.

Candidates competing for the scholarship satisfy very high selection standards. Students must demonstrate outstanding academics, involvement in extracurricular activities and dedication to leadership.

Application for this scholarship is on an invitation basis. Finalists must attend Scholars Interview Weekend on February 11-12, 2010. Students must rsvp and submit an essay and resume before Interview Weekend. Finalists will interview with a faculty member, meet current Camras Scholars, and stay for the weekend in a fraternity/sorority house or residence hall. The Camras Review Committee will meet to award scholarships promptly after Scholars Interview Weekend.



To be considered for the Camras Scholars Program, students must meet the Early Action I deadline of **December 9, 2009**.

> **Invitations** will be sent out by the end of January. Along with returning the rsvp, essays and resume, students may also submit additional letters of recommendation. These letters of recommendation are optional.
